CHIP of Virginia, a public private partnership and 501(c)3 organization, receives broad support from both the public and private sectors. In FY13, the Virginia General Assembly allocated \$1,910,574. CHIP leveraged \$6,301,093 from other public and private sources—including significant community investments at the local level from individuals, corporations, partner agencies, local governments and third-party reimbursements/managed care contracts.

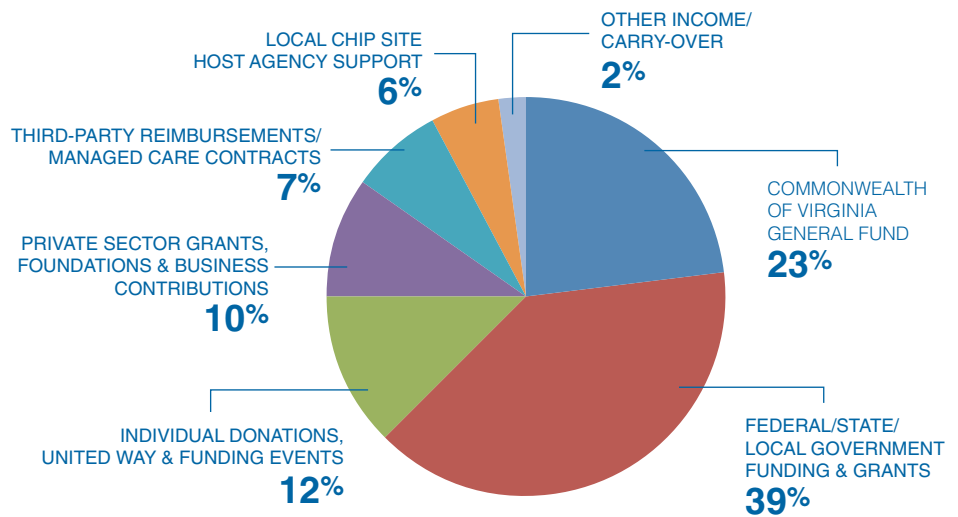
